State of the Region Report 2010

The data of the report highlights some of the threats that the Region is faced with in trying to regain the high growth rates that used to characterise the region a few years ago. This year, special focus will be on the three Baltic States and Poland. As for the Baltic countries, the Report identifies some of the structural changes that need to be made in the economy if the countries are to return to an acceptable growth path in the future. Poland's resilience against to the global crisis will also be taken up.

After the presentation by Christian Ketels of the main findings of the report during the Summit opening, the workshop will allow the Summit participants to know more details and to take active part in discussing what needs to be done for increasing the Region's competitiveness, improving strategic actions in the regional cooperation and attracting foreign investors. The Baltic Guidance on the Governance of Government-Owned Enterprises

Best practice guidance for governance of the state- and municipality-owned Baltic enterprises will be inaugurated at the event dedicated to regional and international media and BDF Summit participants. Government-owned enterprises represent a significant share of economic activity and have an important economic and social impact. Thus inefficiencies in their governance come at a high public cost. Better governance of such enterprises would have a positive impact on state budgets, on the public's perception of government, and on the quality of infrastructure and services as well as make the Baltic region more attractive to foreign investment. Development of the Guidance and recommendations for improved governance will be presented by **Arminta Saladžienė**, Chairman of Baltic Institute of Corporate Governance and **Richard Frederick**, international expert in governance and author of the Guidance.
