The spotlight is turned on the challenges and opportunities for the Baltic Sea Region in terms of infrastructure development, investment, and economic competitiveness as well as public-private cooperation. This includes transport, energy, ICT/digital agenda, water etc.

To become a smarter and greener region, public-private partnerships are essential. By improving framework conditions, these partnerships can help to focus and optimize sustainable infrastructure investment, what is a key to kick-starting wider economic growth in the region, benefiting the European economy at large.

The European Commission's improved strategic framework for cooperation in the Baltic Sea Region will be known at the Summit in June. It will be a hot topic in the discussions about kick-starting the economic growth in order to reach the Europe 2020 targets. More streamlined and coherent efforts in the Baltic Sea Region will be on the agenda as well as strengthening the synergies between regional and national initiatives and policies.

The speakers at the "Connecting Europe – Smart and Green Partnership" event will reflect this public-private agenda, and anchor it firmly within the Europe 2020 Strategy and the proposal for a Connecting Europe facility.

From around 60 high level speakers you will have the pleasure of listening to Helle Thorning-Schmidt, Danish Prime Minister, Johannes Hahn, EU Commissioner for Regional Policy, and Nicolai Wammen, Danish Minister of European Affairs, who is inviting his colleagues from around Europe and Russia including the Russian Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs.

Moreover you will have a chance to be part of a discussion inspired by speakers from the European Parliament, Nordic Investment Bank, European Investment Bank, European Bank for Reconstruction and Development, Confederation of Danish Industry, Baltic Chamber of Commerce Association, Regional Metropolises and many other speakers from politics, business and academia.
